ollowing her nomination for the Halifax Award by Stephen Whitelegg, Sylvia Tinsley won this local award for her work with the Brigade and her Church.

Sylvia has been a dedicated volunteer at the youth organisation, the Church Lads' and Church Girls' Brigade registered charity, for almost 50 years. In her 70s, Sylvia still runs activities every Friday night for 5-21 year olds in one of the most deprived areas of Manchester; she also drives the minibus and caters at youth events (conferences, training, fundraisers, weekend camps, competitions).

Sylvia's generosity includes an 'open door' approach to her home where she warmly welcomes young people, giving them a sense of acceptance and value as part of a wider family. Sylvia manages the community building (home to the Brigade) and is the driving force behind the annual Summer and Christmas fairs.

Many of the elderly rely on Sylvia to get to church and to community events. If someone is in hospital, Sylvia helps and visits them. She is the heart and anchor of



a caring network of help and support and we don't know what we would do without her.

As a local winner Sylvia went forward into the Regional awards but unfortunately Sylvia was not successful this year as one of our regional winners.
